KEY TASKS FOR PUPILS

TIPS FOR PARENTS

Recording homework in homework diary;

Making sure homework is done for the correct day;

Making sure you have everything you need to do the homework:

Remember to take the homework to school on the correct day

Establish a routine for homework with your child. The best time is after a short break when your child returns from school: get it out of the way early and leave the rest of the evening free;

Agree with your child that TV, playing sport, Youth Club, phone-calls etc., will only be allowed after homework is completed;

Encourage your child to unpack and pack his/ her bag in an organised way;

Offer support but don't do it for them.

Sign your child's homework.

Encourage your child to record homework carefully. Pupils don't always remember what 'finish stuff' means!
